Covenant Kids

Covenant Kids continues to welcome new families and kids to our ministry areas. We serve around 210 children on an average Sunday morning, discipling kids to connect with God and others. CCB reveals over 1,000 kids in our database. The ministry is blessed with 250 volunteers who serve. Covenant Kids welcomed Kristi Ferguson as the Director of Nursery and Preschool Ministry this past year! We are thankful for Kristi's commitment to our littlest church members.

Child discipleship is about pointing kids to faith in God and building relationships. We accomplish this through Nursery ministry, Kids Church, Preschool and Elementary Sunday School, and Awana programs.

Ministry highlights from this year:

- Provided a "Milestone" gift to Nursery and Preschool families that included resources to help them in discipling their littles
- Offered Milestone classes for 1st-5th grade kids and their families
- Delivered gift baskets for babies to parents of newborns in the church
- Created a "Quiet Room" in the

Pre-K Zone that has become a beloved space for many kids

- Shared the good news of Jesus with 350 children through Vacation Bible School
- Had a record 79 participants in our Bibles by the Bedside program this past spring!
- Added a "Drive-In Movie" option to our annual movie night for preschool-kindergarten kids
- Hosted an end of year Faith & Science family event
- Our kids and youth packed 1000 meals for United Way's Backpack Attack program
- Encouraged kids' hearts for giving through VBS and Awana Go! Mission projects
- Collected gifts for Operation Christmas Child and had an Awana packing party
- Watched our 5th grade "CK Crew" students serve and lead our younger students
- Added several new books and
 resources to our Lending Library
- Engaged and equipped parents through our "Pressure Points: Parenting in a Changing World" class

Student Ministry

We have the privilege of serving about 200 students with the help of our amazing team of 36 volunteers! We're also thrilled to see so many of our students plugging in to serve our church family throughout the year in various ways. In addition to youth group and Sunday school, we also have opportunities throughout the year for our students to step outside of their everyday routines and gather with others to worship, grow, and serve.

Some highlights from our year include: M.U.U.U.C.E | August 2023

We took 31 students to this annual Covenant event. It was a weekend full of fun and faith formation specifically designed with middle schoolers in mind! This year's theme reminded them that we serve a God who turns ordinary people and moments into extraordinary, and we can celebrate that 3 students gave their lives to Jesus!

Middle School Fall Retreat at Trout Lake Camp | October 2023

37 students headed up to Pine River, MN to take part in our annual fall retreat. Chapel sessions focused on recognizing our purpose and allowing God to work in and through us.

High School District Youth Conference January 2024

54 students (8th-12th grade) drove

to Green Bay, braved a blizzard, and pushed our bus uphill (multiple times) to spend time worshiping alongside thousands of their peers. This year's theme challenged students to step out in faith, and not let their doubts, fears, or mistakes hold them back from fully living into a relationship with Jesus. We were thrilled to have 6 students make the decision to accept Christ at Districts this year!

High School Missions Trip | June 2024

14 students and 6 leaders had the opportunity to go and serve Tipi Wakan in Cannon Ball, ND. It was a great week of using the gifts God has given us to bless the community while also learning about their culture and continuing to deepen the relationship with the people there.

This year has also held an extra dose of anticipation, gratefulness and transition for our student ministry as we celebrated Pastor Brian and Joyce's faithful ministry to our students and as we searched for, and finally welcomed, our new Pastor of Student Ministry, Greg Schanil, his wife Myranda, and their boys, Owen and Evan. We look forward to watching how God will continue to work in the lives of our students and volunteers in the days and years ahead as we begin this new chapter together.

Technical Ministry

The Technical Ministry has continued to grow over the past year in many exciting ways! Our weekly average online attendance has grown to over 300 people, up from 260 last year. This highlights the importance of online ministry for those interested in the church or those unable to attend







in-person. To help with the online production, we have found volunteers from all ages, adding another 10 kids to the team under the age of 13! These kids know how to jump right in and it has been so exciting watching them grow in a ministry they love to volunteer in! We have continued to also provide support, consultation and guidance to rural churches both in and out of the Covenant denomination. As an example, last month I drove up to International Falls to the Covenant church and got to meet with their team to discuss ways to grow and improve their Sunday morning experience, both online and in-person. They were so appreciative, and it definitely highlights the importance of the in-person

meeting with these churches to both get to know their whole team and volunteers, along with understanding their story and the direction they would like to go. -David LeVahn

Some highlights from this past year include Hymn Sings, Worship Nights, and hosting three concerts (Red Letter Band, Preacher's Daughters, and Sidewalk Prophets), as well as collaborating with worship leaders from First Covenant in Willmar to lead worship for the Rural Impact Leadership Conference. We also had seven members of the CK Crew (5th grade leaders) help us lead Sunday worship. How exciting to see the next generation of leaders engaging in worship!

I'm so grateful for the team I get to work with, and I'm grateful for all of you!

A Note from the Senior Pastor

"I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, always in every prayer of mine for you all making my prayer with joy, because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now. And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ." - Philippians 1:3-6.

At Alexandria Covenant Church our mission is to be a people committed to loving Jesus, becoming like Jesus, and sharing Jesus with the world. This year as we have been intentional about living into that mission, we have focused on four values. These values include being Bible Based, Gospel Centered, Relationally Driven, and Dependent on the Holy Spirit, to the glory of God and for our neighbor's good.

Last July, we held our first annual Serving Sunday. Our goal was to be a blessing to our community through tangible acts of service to local businesses, non-profits, and individuals who had specific needs. We completed over 35 projects with the help of around 400 volunteers from our church family!

In an effort to be good stewards of all that God has blessed us with, we launched a Capital Campaign with the goal of eliminating the church mortgage of \$1.152 million, replacing a section of shingles on the roof, and replacing our parking lot. Praise God for His provision that has been experienced through His people! Thanks to your generosity we paid off our mortgage and will soon have enough cash to cover the roof project expenses! With two more years of the Capital Campaign remaining, we are well on our way to reaching our goal of \$1.75 million.

We were excited to have the opportunity to host the third annual Rural Impact Leadership Conference in March. This is a one-day conference intended to equip, encourage, and resource rural church pastors and leaders for work and ministry in their own unique contexts. We are grateful for our partnership with the Northwest Conference and Oak Hills Bible College in providing this intentional space for rural leaders to connect, grow, and be refreshed. We had around 200 people attend in person and 25 online participants.

We support 11 global, 13 local, and 7 regional mission partners in advancing the gospel throughout the world. These partnerships give us the opportunity to join God in His mission to see more disciples among more populations in a more caring and just world.

Our church is growing in and beyond the walls of our building! Our online ministry is regularly reaching 300+ people from 15 states around the

U.S. each week. Our in-person attendance has grown as well, prompting us to move our fellowship space down to the Gym. This move created opportunity for both a meaningful worship experience in the Patio and extended times of connection and conversation.

Two things that continue to be a highlight for me are our jail ministry and our believer baptism services. I am so encouraged in witnessing how God shows up each time we go to minister at the jail. There is such joy in watching people's lives being transformed through the Word of God and the power of the Holy Spirit. We were able to hold two believer baptism Sundays this year as well. I hope that being a part of witnessing the transformative work of God, through baptism, is as much a blessing to you all as it is to me! Another exciting thing to note is that we welcomed 31 people into church membership this year!

On a personal level, I've enjoyed my weekly study time, and am often challenged and encouraged in my own walk as I spend time in prayer and preparation, seeking God's wisdom to faithfully handle His word through teaching and preaching. Sermon series this past year included the Beatitudes, the Book of Ephesians and The Ten Commandments. We are currently in a series on the Book of James.


