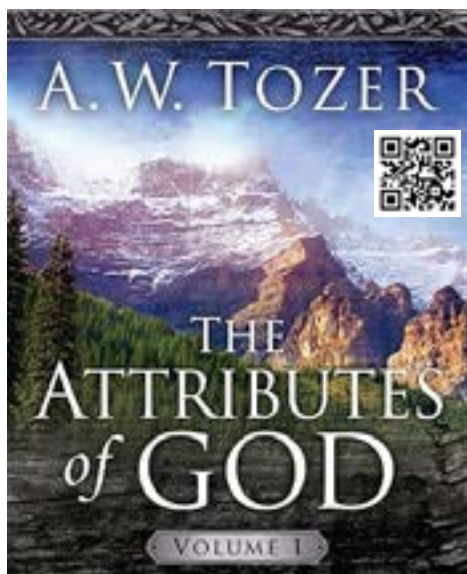



RightNow Media: Easter by J.D. Greear

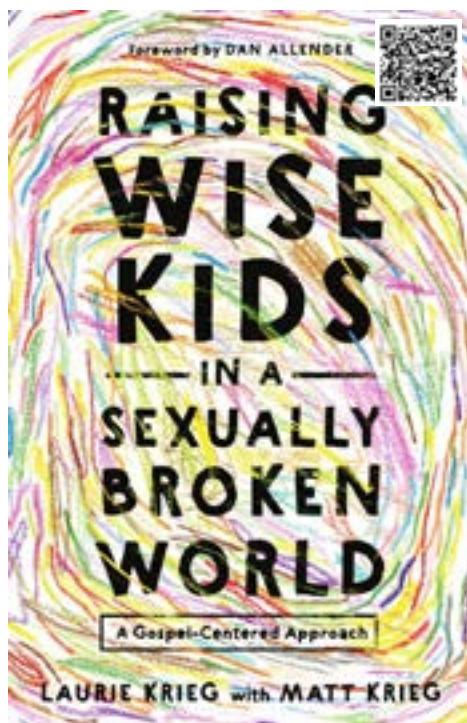
