From June 6-13, our group of 20 served at Alaska Christian College in Soldotna, Alaska. ACC had its start 25 years ago with this purpose in mind; "Our vision is to be the premier college of choice for Alaska Native students so that our graduates follow and serve Christ within the Church and larger society". The student body at ACC is made up of Native Alaskans from all over Alaska, as well as students from the "lower 48". This diverse group of students can earn an AA degree in General Studies, Christian Ministry, Paraprofessional Education and Behavioral Health (currently on pause).

In the past 25 years, the campus has been built and maintained largely through volunteer labor. Volunteer groups, called "Sowers", fly into Anchorage and drive to Soldotna (on the Kenai Peninsula) all summer to work on needed projects. Our team, along with 7 from Plymouth Covenant, served during the first project week of the 2026 summer season.

Our team had a unique experience on our way to Alaska. After loading the vans at 4:30 am Saturday and driving to MSP, we boarded our flight to Anchorage. About half hour into the flight the pilot got on the intercom and said they were having some electrical problems, and we'd be returning to Minneapolis. We landed with firetrucks following our plane down the landing strip and ambulances on standby. After deplaning, we found out from the pilot that they had lost electrical controls to the flaps (had to manually crank them) and they also lost autopilot. Thankfully they had another plane available and we took off and landed in Anchorage about 2 ½ hours late.

Our projects for the week were diverse. We had a group that spent their time in the "sewing palace" where they sewed backpacks and Kuspuks (traditional outerwear). These items will be for sale through different outlets. Another group worked on landscaping and grounds. They weeded, planted flowers, took



down the hockey rink, mowed and made the grounds look beautiful. Storage areas were cleaned and organized and cages were put around newly planted trees (much to the surprise of the local moose we saw most days).

We had a group working with heavier equipment, as they installed 2 culverts. This group also moved lots of dirt and rock as they filled and compacted the new road to the gym. Another group moved downed trees with large equipment and spent time with chainsaws. One group worked outside on the new lobby area of the gym. This group did trim work on windows and doors to get ready for siding installation. Several worked inside the new lobby. There were carpentry projects, taping and mudding, as well as some prep work in the saunas. We also got to see the foundation being laid for the new chapel (last major building project in the master plan), which they hope to open in the spring. They will be looking for electricians and trim carpenters this fall and winter for the chapel project if you are interested.

Our week wasn't all work; we had time for some "Alaskan Adventures". We had eight people go halibut fishing on Sunday where they limited out on halibut and cod. Another group went on a fjord cruise on Sunday. Some went on an evening hike and ended up on the shores of a beautiful lake. We had worship and devotions in the mornings; bonfires, card playing, talking, and ice cream in the evenings. Friday, we went to Homer to see some shops, check out the marina, and have some halibut fish and chips.

Our team came home tired, but excited to see what God is doing through Alaska Christian College.
