



Covenant Kids

This past year, Covenant Kids volunteers and staff took advantage of numerous discipleship opportunities, pointing kids to faith in God. Intergenerational relationships were built and strengthened. Nursery ministry, Kids Church, Preschool/ Elementary Sunday School, and midweek Awana programming were all utilized to build a firm faith foundation for children.





Pastor Chanda and Director Kristi attended the Children's Pastors Conference in January. In April, Emma Schonberg was welcomed as the Coordinator of Nursery and Kid Care Ministry! Pastor Chanda was a guest speaker at the Rural Impact Leadership Conference in March. Kristi completed a nine-month International Network of Children's Ministry certification in Child and Family Ministry in May.

Ministry Highlights:

- Kids of all ages are learning, growing, and sharing their faith with their families at home.
- Superhero Movie Night featured "live" superheroes from our congregation who shared how God has equipped them to serve others (emergency response, healthcare, military). Kids were reminded that Jesus is the greatest superhero!
- Family Movie Event at Cinema 9: Families watched The King of Kings and received an Easter Activity Pack to encourage discipleship at home.
- 18 elementary kids were baptized.
- Milestone "grab and go" resources were distributed to 30 nursery and 47 preschool families to equip parents for spiritual conversations at home.
- Milestone classes were offered to 1st-5th graders and their families on topics such as the Bible, the Gospel, Sacraments, Big Questions, and spiritual disciplines.
- Baby gift baskets were delivered to newborns.
- Trauma-informed care and behavioral guidelines were taught and implemented.
- Vacation Bible School Jungle Journey ministered to 355 children.
- Bibles by the Bedside had 76 participants and 46 four-month finishers who received T-shirts.
- Covenant Kids staff and volunteers attended the Awana Regional Training Conference at ACC in August.
- Preschool kids sang at Christmas and Easter worship services.
- CK Crew (5th-grade leader team) served elementary students and led worship at Fall Fest and the May 18 Volunteer Recognition Sunday.

Student Ministry

High School

We've had the privilege of serving about 100 high school students with the help of our incredible team of 17 volunteers! This year was full of growth—both spiritually and relationally—as we gathered for youth group, Sunday school, retreats, and service opportunities.

Our theme was More to the Story. We explored how there's always more to learn about God and that each of us is invited to be part of His unfolding story. This year, I introduced moments of reflection after our lessons. I loved seeing students learn to connect with God on their own.









In January, 57 students and leaders attended the Districts Conference in Green Bay, where we explored the Good News of Jesus—how the Gospel shapes our atonement, identity, belonging, and purpose.

In June, 17 students and 4 leaders traveled to Des Moines, IA, for our Summer Project, putting on a Vacation Bible School at Shalom Covenant Church. It was an incredible week of ministry and relationship-building with our Congolese brothers and sisters.

This marks my first full year here, and it's been a joy getting to know the amazing students and leaders. I'm excited to see how God continues to work in and through this ministry.

Middle School

This year, our Middle School ministry walked alongside over 75 students and their families as we explored more of who God is and who He's calling us to be. On Sunday mornings, confirmation students journeyed through the Old Testament, discovering how every part of Scripture points to Jesus and the gospel. It's been amazing to see them ask deep questions and grasp the bigger picture of God's redemptive story.

Our youth group theme was More to the Story, reminding us that with God, there's always more—more hope, more purpose, more grace.

We had incredible experiences beyond our weekly programs:

- MUUUCE (a high-energy weekend for middle schoolers) focused on the theme No Matter What, reminding students of God's unconditional love.
- Trout Lake Retreat in the fall helped us dig deep into who Jesus is as King of Kings.
- 8th Grade opportunities included Districts Conference and the summer mission trip to Shalom Covenant Church.

One of my favorite parts of this ministry is seeing relationships form—between students and leaders and with one another. I love watching our middle schoolers serve in Kids Ministry, hospitality, and the Production Team. Their creativity and servant hearts bless our church family! It's been a year full of growth, laughter, questions, and so many snacks—and I wouldn't trade it for anything. Thank you for supporting and investing in these students. God is doing something amazing in them!

Adult Ministry

The heart of Adult Formation Ministry is this: Loving Jesus, Becoming like Jesus, and Sharing Jesus. I continually ask how our groups and activities support the mission of our church—and I believe that when we gather in community around God's Word, transformation happens.

Adult Formation includes small groups, Adult Sunday school, Koffee & Kare, Sew to Share, men's and women's ministries, prayer, marriage and care ministries, college and young adult ministries, special events, mission trips, Next Steps Quarterly, and our Resource Wall.

Ministry Highlights:

- Over 50 small group opportunities, all aimed at knowing the God of the Bible and living transformed lives.
- Adult Sunday School saw 100+ attendees covering topics like apologetics, church history, and learning biblical Hebrew.
- Summer Table Groups launched: 33 host tables with 325+ participants.
- Koffee & Kare, Sew to Share, and the Men's Prayer Group offered community-focused ways to serve and support.
- Men's and Women's Ministries hosted events like sports outings and brunches, creating space to connect and grow.
- New growth is emerging in areas







- like prayer, marriage, and young adult ministry.
- Community care partnerships like GriefShare and Celebrate Recovery support both church members and the wider community.
- Special events included Bond on the Pond and Prepare Him Room, drawing in both members and guests.
- Mission Trip to Alaska: 21 people served Alaska Christian College with joy and energy.
- Our Resource Wall near the Patio entrance continues to expand, offering biblical materials to help people grow in faith. Over 24 book resources were given away! These and other resources are also available in the library—don't miss checking it out.
- Scripture journals for sermon series and seasonal devotionals for Advent and Lent were made available to keep our hearts centered on Jesus.

This ministry doesn't happen without our amazing facilitators and leaders. We've seen an increase in new facilitators, and I'm so excited for what's ahead. Want to take your next step? Consider joining or leading a group!

We've been busy in worship ministry this year! Our team of 70+ volunteers continues to be dedicated to our mission of fostering authentic worship at Alexandria Covenant. In addition to our regular Sunday morning worship, we hosted hymn sings, worship nights, 2 concerts, and led worship for the Rural Impact Leadership Conference. I am so grateful for the teams we have!

A highlight from this past year is how many opportunities we've had to encourage the involvement of kids and youth in our worship. I love to see the multi-generational teams! We've added more youth to our Sunday morning worship team. We've seen some of our youth join the choir. Our CK Crew was back again to lead worship in May. And the kids' choir for our Christmas Cantata was a huge win! They were

First Impressions, Hospitality & Assimilation

What a year it has been! In May of 2024, I stepped into the role of Director of Engagement. This past year has been filled with learning, connecting, serving, growing, and receiving so much encouragement and grace. It's been a joy to join this role and work alongside an incredible staff team and church family.

We currently have over 300 volunteers









serving in our First Impressions and Hospitality ministries, which include the Welcome Desk, Greeters, Ushers, Hospitality, and ACCERT. On an average Sunday, it takes about 55 volunteers to cover all of our needs. It's been such a privilege to meet so many people who joyfully and faithfully serve in these roles.

In September, we moved the coffee area from the Gym to the Hall to foster better connection and fellowship between services. It's been a fantastic spot for people of all ages to gather and catch up. I started keeping track of coffee orders after the move—70 cases! That equals about 33,600 cups of coffee in just 10 months.

Event planning has also been a highlight! It's been fun to find creative ways to bring our church family together.

- Summer Fest was a big success we served over 650 hot dogs!
- We added Fall Fest for the first time, and around 250 people came for food, games, and worship.
- Wednesday Night Meals became a monthly night of connection, especially in the second half of the school year—we were serving 250-275 people each time!

In addition to these larger events, I've had the privilege of assisting with Men's











and Women's Ministry events, Exploring Membership, RILC, the John DeLancey Conference, and even a special event honoring Police Officers and First Responders, among others.

Connect Cards have been a valuable tool for getting to know those who are new to our church or looking to get involved. This year, we received 77 Connect Cards! It's been such a blessing to walk alongside people as they discover where God is calling them to serve and belong.

The new Connect at Covenant Wall has been a fun and helpful addition—it highlights upcoming events and features photos from past gatherings. It's one more way for people to see what's happening and where they can plug in. The screen addition has allowed us to share even more—and it's been a joy to

partner with Linda LeVahn on this!

We've also expanded our social media presence on Instagram and Facebook, which often serves as someone's first impression before ever stepping through our doors. It's been such fun to capture photos and video snippets at events that showcase the life and activity of our church throughout the week. If you ever have pictures from events—send them my way! We love sharing what our church family is up to!

This is just a glimpse into what God has done this past year. I can't wait to see how He continues to bless and grow our church in the year ahead. If you feel God nudging your heart to serve, know that He will equip you. Let's connect and find a place that's a good fit for you!
